Celebrates 60 years in business and gives back to the community

St. Louis, Supply, Inc., distributor, locations in Missouri and Illinois, will be celebrating their 60th year anniversary in 2008. In celebration of their anniversary, Cee Kay has developed a plan to give back to the community. The plan is to donate a total of \$60,000, in increments of \$5,000 per month, to twelve local charities throughout 2008. Suggestions from management and employees will assist in determining the organizations we will donate to each month.

For January – 2008, the decision was made to donate \$5,000 to The BackStoppers. The BackStoppers provides needed support and financial assistance to the spouses and children of all local and county police officers, firefighters, publicly-funded paramedics, EMTs and volunteer fire protection units, who have lost their lives performing their duty. The donation was recommended by Kevin Kimker – Fill Plant Manager for Cee Kay Supply, Inc.

For February – 2008, the decision was made to donate \$5,000 to The Habitat for Humanity. Habitat for Humanity is an ecumenical Christian housing ministry committed to creating homeownership opportunities for hardworking, low-income families. The donation was recommended by Pat Howe – Territory Manager for Cee Kay Supply, Inc. For March – 2008, the decision was made to donate \$5,000 to Nurses for Newborns. Nurses for Newborn's mission is to provide a safety net for families most at risk; to help prevent infant mortality, child abuse and neglect through home based programs that provide education, healthcare and positive parenting skills. Nurses for Newborns Foundation was founded in 1991. The donation was recommended by Cathy Lepper – Customer Service Representative.

In April – 2008, a \$5,000 donation was given to the Muscular Dystrophy Association. MDA raises money to fund researchers around the world to

help find a cure for the three types of Muscular Dystrophy such as: Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) , Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and Spinal Muscular Atrophy. MDA also provides equipment needed for patients such as handicap equipment and provides medical services for the patients in need. The donation was recommended by Paul Thompson – Account Manager for Cee Kay.

In May – 2008 , a \$5,000 donation was given to The Agape House in St. Clair, MO The Agape house is a ministry that assists under privileged families with food, clothing and shelter. They also assist individuals with professional training skills required to obtain jobs and support their families. The donation was recommended by Terry Temple – who works out at Cee Kay's Villa Ridge branch store.

The June – 2008 donation of \$5,000 went to the Susan G. Komen – Race for the Cure. Komen for the Cure is the world's largest grassroots network of breast cancer survivors and activists fighting to save lives, empower people, ensure quality care for all and energize science to find the cures for Breast Cancer. Thanks to events like the Komen Race for the Cure, nearly \$1 billion has been raised world wide. The donation was recommended by Linda Pierce – Cee Kay's Marketing Manager.

The July – 2008 donation of \$ 5,000 went to The American Red Cross, Disaster Relief fund. Red Cross disaster relief focuses on meeting people's immediate emergency disaster-caused needs. When a disaster threatens or strikes, the Red Cross provides shelter, food, health and mental health services to address basic human needs . The donation was recommended in conjunction with our 60 year anniversary celebration, to which Cee Kay hosted a blood drive and collected almost 40 units of blood for the Red Cross.

For the month of August, Cee Kay donated \$5,000 to The Amy Center located in Mount Vernon, IL. The Amy Center, which is named for murder and sexual assault victim Amy Schulz, opened its doors in 1990. The mission of the center is to provide a coordinated, multi-disciplinary approach

to child sexual abuse investigations which recognize the special needs of child victims while demanding accountability for the crime of child sexual abuse. The donation was recommended by Cee Kay employees Mike Freed and Bob Chamberlain.

In September-2008, Cee Kay donated \$5,000 to the Make A Wish foundation. Since 1980, the Foundation has enriched the lives of children through its wish-granting work. Their mission of granting wishes to children with life threatening conditions reflects the impact that a Make-A-Wish® experience has on children, families, referral sources, donors, sponsors and communities. Cee Kay's Human Resource Administrator-Lisa Lorts suggested the organization for this month.

The October, 2008, donation went to Teen Challenge of St. Louis. The organization provides residential rehabilitative care to men, ages 18 to 30, who are struggling with life-controlling problems. Any individual who cannot function normally in society due to drug addiction, alcoholism, or behavioral problems is eligible to receive help at Teen Challenge of St. Louis. The donation was presented to the organization from our newest retail location in Pevely, MO; and was recommended by Cee Kay employee Dave Volkman.

In November – 2008, Cee Kay donated \$5,000 to The Special Olympics. The nonprofit organization is dedicated to empowering individuals with intellectual disabilities to become physically fit, productive and respected members of society through sports training and competition. The Illinois branch to which the donation was presented represents Illinois counties such as St. Clair, Clinton, Bond, Fayette, Montgomery, Washington and Monroe. They also work with more than 1,000 athletes in the Southwestern area. The donation was recommended by the employees working out of our retail store in O'Fallon, Illinois (St. Clair).

December – 2008 donations went to two organizations. Operation Food Search and The Haven Grace each received \$2,500.

Haven Grace is a residential and aftercare program for pregnant and homeless women. Their focus is to provide education, support and resources to mothers and children as they become families and establish

their lives together in the community. The donation was suggested by Cee Kay employee Chris Snyder.
